

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Major pollution producing industries and waste producing facilities are put in the places where lower income people often live because there are fewer laws preventing the pollution.

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For many years people of color have been excluded from the outdoor recreation community. They have not been able to enjoy nature in the same way, or participate in environmental movements in the same way.







Particulate or particle pollution is the air pollution created when fossil


fuels are burned, and that can cause damage for peoples' lungs.

DRINKING WATER

Groundwater is the main source of drinking water for one of every two Americans.

Every day scientists are discovering more chemicals in the water, usually in lower-income communities.






BROWNFIELDS

These are places where hazardous substances have been left behind and abandoned from past projects, but may still be causing harm. They can remain in the ground and potentially cause health issues.





PARTICULATE POLLUTION

Air pollution caused by the combustion of fossil fuels; particulate matter includes road dust, soot, ash, smoke, and more that are suspended in the air and can cause health issues for people living in these areas.



- 5. Invest in young people to encourage innovation
- 6.Listen to the communities most affected by these issues
- 7. Develop equitable climate policy
